#### Introduction

- Sportlytix collected fan-generated mock expansion drafts entered after the trade deadline and before the expansion draft
  - Only feasible mock drafts, meeting ALL constraints considered → 307 in total
- Sportlytix's analysis compared those to the Vegas Golden Knights' actual expansion draft selections
  - Plus trades conducted at the time of the draft
- Objectives of this report:
  - Assess the accuracy of the mock drafts
  - Gain insights into the Golden Knights' strategy
  - Examine the various strategies of the 30 incumbent teams
  - Possible next steps for 30 incumbent teams


#### **Additional Considerations:**

- 1. Vegas also acquired a 2017 6<sup>th</sup> round pick from **Buffalo**
- 2. Vegas also acquired Reilly Smith from Florida; traded their 2018 4th to Florida
- 3. Vegas also acquired Nikita Gusev, a 2017 2<sup>nd</sup>, and a 2018 4<sup>th</sup> from **Tampa Bay**
- 4. Vegas also acquired a 2017 5<sup>th</sup> round pick from Carolina
- 5. Vegas also acquired David Clarkson, a 2017 1st, and a 2019 2nd from Columbus
- 6. Vegas also acquired Mikhail Grabovski, Jake Bischoff, a 2017 1<sup>st</sup> (15<sup>th</sup> overall), and a 2019 2<sup>nd</sup> from the **New York Islanders**
- 7. Vegas also acquired a 2018 2<sup>nd</sup> from **Pittsburgh**
- 8. Vegas traded van Riemsdyk and a 2018 7<sup>th</sup> to Carolina for Carolina's 2017 2<sup>nd</sup>
- 9. Vegas also acquired Alex Tuch from Minnesota; traded a 2017 or 2018 3<sup>rd</sup> to Minnesota
- 10. Vegas also acquired 2017 1st (13th overall) and a 2019 3<sup>rd</sup> from **Winnipeg**; traded their 2017 1<sup>st</sup> (24<sup>th</sup> overall) to Winnipeg
- 11. Vegas also added Shea Theodore from **Anaheim**

#### **Takeaways:**

Vegas converted 30 picks into 36 players plus 8 additional picks in the next 4 drafts



#### **NHL Expansion Draft: Top Mocked Players**

#### **Takeaways:**

- 1. 7 of the top ten mocked players were selected by the Golden Knights
- 2. 11 of the top 20 mocked players were selected
- 3. 4 of 5 players named in at least 50% of mock drafts were selected
- 4. Only 15 of top 40 mocked players were selected
- 5. Of the top 40 players mocked, only 3 of 17 named in less than 30% of drafts were selected
- 6. Half of Vegas' selections (15) were named in fewer than 20% of mock drafts (not shown)




#### **Takeaways:**

- 1. 13 of Vegas' picks were mocked in the top position of their respective teams
- 2. 20 of the Golden Knights' selections were mocked in positions 1 4 of their respective teams
- 3. Vegas selected players from 5 teams (ARI, CAL, NYI, PHI, and WPG) that were not mocked (blue bars on chart)

## **NHL Expansion Draft: Vegas' Picks by Category**



- 37 players acquired on Draft Day, 3 since traded\*
- Roughly evenly split between youth (25- years old) / experience (26+ years old)
- Available salary cap space was used to absorb unwanted contracts (6) of incumbent teams
- Each "absorbed contract" also came with a young prospect and, in some cases, draft picks

### Insights, Conclusions, Open Questions

- Overall mock drafts offered reasonable insight into actual draft 20 of 30 picks were mocked in positions 1 -4 of their respective team
- Mock draft accuracy hampered by inability to model trades
  - Could mean the next expansion draft might have constraints limiting the "side deals."
  - Did NHL envision this type of outcome (encourage side deals) or did they miss something here?
- Stronger the mock draft sentiment about a given player correlated with that player being chosen
  - 4 of 5 mocked over 50% / 7 of 12 mocked over 40% were chosen
  - Incumbent teams can use this next time around for insight into potential side deals. You take this guy, we'll trade for him, etc.
- Mock draft accuracy diminished greatly with diminishment of sentiment
  - Only 8 of 28 mocked under 40% / 3 of 17 mocked under 30% were chosen
- Vegas used its unique position to acquire a significant number of additional players,
  draft picks to build for the future
  - Will the NHL add constraints to the next expansion draft to hinder or encourage?

## Insights, Conclusions, Open Questions (cont.)

- Rather than go best player available across the board, Vegas split almost evenly between youth / experience
  - Incumbent teams would do well to brainstorm on Expansion Team's execution for insights to employ to their franchises
- Vegas used available salary cap space to absorb expensive contracts of veterans from several teams
  - Absorbing expensive vets is probably more valuable to incumbent teams than VGK anticipated
- In return, the Golden Knights received at least one young prospect, and in some cases draft pick(s)
  - How, if at all, does VGK's execution differ from your own franchise?
- By stockpiling future draft picks, Vegas
  - Mitigates immediate risks
  - Ensures it will receive extended value from a "one off" event
  - Incumbent teams would do well to study VGK in detail for insights about the league it contains
- Going forward, implementing of decision-making analytic structure will offer significant advantages for high-impact decisions
